

## Apply to be a Ceramic Arts Teacher

Clay Art Center located in Port Chester, NY is seeking **ceramic teaching artists to join our roster of teaching artists for offsite afterschool programs**.

Our offsite programs take place in schools, recreation centers, and other community organizations working primarily with elementary school students. Teachers lead students in handbuilding and glazing projects.

This is an independent contractor position. Teachers may be asked to teach 1-3 classes in locations in Westchester and Fairfield counties per session depending on our needs. Afterschool classes typically run from 3-4pm (not including travel or prep time).

Teaching pay rate starts at \$70 per hour for offsite programs and varies based on program type, location, and class size. Teachers must have their own transportation.

No teaching experience required; training will be provided. Must have familiarity with ceramics and a desire to engage youth through clay.
